Quattro donne e nove bambini legati all'ISIS sono in procinto di tornare in Australia dai campi di detenzione nel nord-est della Siria nel corso della giornata, e alcune delle donne potrebbero venire incriminate al loro arrivo.

Almeno una donna e un bambino dovrebbero atterrare a Sydney questa sera, mentre le restanti donne e bambini dovrebbero arrivare a Melbourne.

La polizia federale australiana ha dichiarato che alcune delle donne potrebbero essere arrestate se ci fossero prove sufficienti per incriminarle, mentre i bambini dovranno essere sottoposti a programmi di reinserimento e di sostegno contro l'estremismo.

Il senatore indipendente dell'ACT David Pocock ha dichiarato a Channel 9 che i bambini non dovrebbero essere colpevolizzati per le decisioni prese dagli adulti.

Four women and nine children linked to I-S are set to return to Australia from detention camps in north-east Syria later today, with some of the women expected to face criminal charges on arrival.

At least one woman and a child are expected to land in Sydney this evening, with the remaining women and children due to arrive in Melbourne.

Australian Federal Police say some of the women could be arrested if there is enough evidence to charge them, while the children are expected to undergo reintegration and counter-extremism support programs.

Independent ACT Senator David Pocock has told Channel 9 that the children should not be blamed for decisions made by adults.

Police have recovered the body of a man after a car plunged into a weir south of Sydney on Wednesday morning.
